COVID-19 Vaccines

East Central has both the monovalent and bivalent vaccines for Moderna, Pfizer, and Novavax. These vaccines are available for ages 6 months and older.

Vaccines for Children (VFC)

VFC offers all recommended vaccines for children ages birth through 18 years who are uninsured, underinsured or have Medicaid.

Vaccines are offered for a recommended donation of \$19.82/vaccine, but no child will be turned away because of an inability to donate.

For your convenience, ECDHD offers children's vaccination clinics in Columbus, Albion and Schuyler for children birth-18 years.

Why Vaccinate?

In the U.S., vaccines have greatly reduced or eliminated many infectious diseases that once routinely killed or harmed infants, children, and adults. However, the viruses and bacteria that cause these diseases still exist and you can still get these diseases if you aren't vaccinated.

Vaccines are one of the safest ways to protect your health. Talk with your healthcare provider about the vaccines you should receive based on your health or other conditions.

Walk-in Clinics

We offer walk-in vaccine clinics at three locations: Columbus, Schuyler and Albion. No appointment is needed. COVID-19 vaccines and boosters are available. Influenza (flu) vaccines are also available during flu season.

Vaccines for Adults (VFA)

ECDHD's Vaccines for Adults (VFA) program offers vaccines for adults, 19 years and older, who are uninsured. Any patient who is 19yrs and older that HAS Medicaid will now be treated as if they have private insurance. VFA suggests a donation of \$19.82/vaccine, but no one will be refused if they are unable to donate.

Vaccines available:

- Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis Vaccine)
- Hep B (Hepatitis B)
- Influenza
- HPV (Human Papilloma Virus)
- Hep A (Hepatitis A)
- TD (Tetanus and Diphtheria)
- Meningo (Meningococcal A,C,W,Y)

ECDHD also provides vaccines for insured patients of all ages, including travel vaccines.
